Meta-Ethics

- ▶ Philosophical Ethics
 - ightharpoonup Emotivism Ethics are whatever feels good
 - ▶ Cognitivism Ethics are ideas that are either wrong or right
 - ▶ Relativism Ethics are dependent on what you believe (ethics = opinions)
 - ▶ Universalism Ethics are independent of what you believe (ethics = universal truths)

Informal Fallacy

- ► A Hasty Generalization occurs when we make a general rule based on a few cases.
 - ▶ Yes, God commanded Abraham to sacrifice his son (Gen. 22)
 - ➤ Yes, God told the Israelites to steal from their Egyptian neighbors (Ex. 11:2 & 12:36)
 - ➤ Yes, God told the Israelites to slaughter the Amalekites, every man, woman, child, or infant (I Sam. 15)
 - ▶ Does this mean that Christians should engage in murder, stealing, and genocide?

Christian Coercion #1



Neil Noesen, 30, a relief pharmacist at the Kmart in a small town in Wisconsin, was the only person on duty one day in 2002 when a University of Wisconsin student came in to refill her prescription for the contraceptive Loestrin FE. According to the Wisconsin department of regulation and licensing, Noesen refused to fill the doctor-approved prescription because of his religious opposition to birth control. He also declined to transfer the prescription to a nearby pharmacy and refused once again when the student returned to the store with police.

Christian Coercion #2



Jennifer Keeton, former student in Augusta State's graduate counseling program insisted on a right - rooted in her Christian beliefs - to counsel lesbian, gay and bisexual clients that being gay is immoral. If she could not get gay clients to abandon their "lifestyle," she would refer them for conversion therapy. She alleged that the university had violated her First Amendment right to the free exercise of her religion when it insisted on ethical remediation.
