Systems Perspective

- Human behavior as the outcome of interactions within and among systems of interrelated parts
- System **feedback mechanisms (+ or -)**: The processes by which information about past behaviors in a system are fed back into the system in a circular manner.
- The structure of roles and boundaries have been important mechanisms for maintaining system balance.
- Open systems (Facebook friends groups) and closed system (family in Idaho City rurality).

Systems Theory

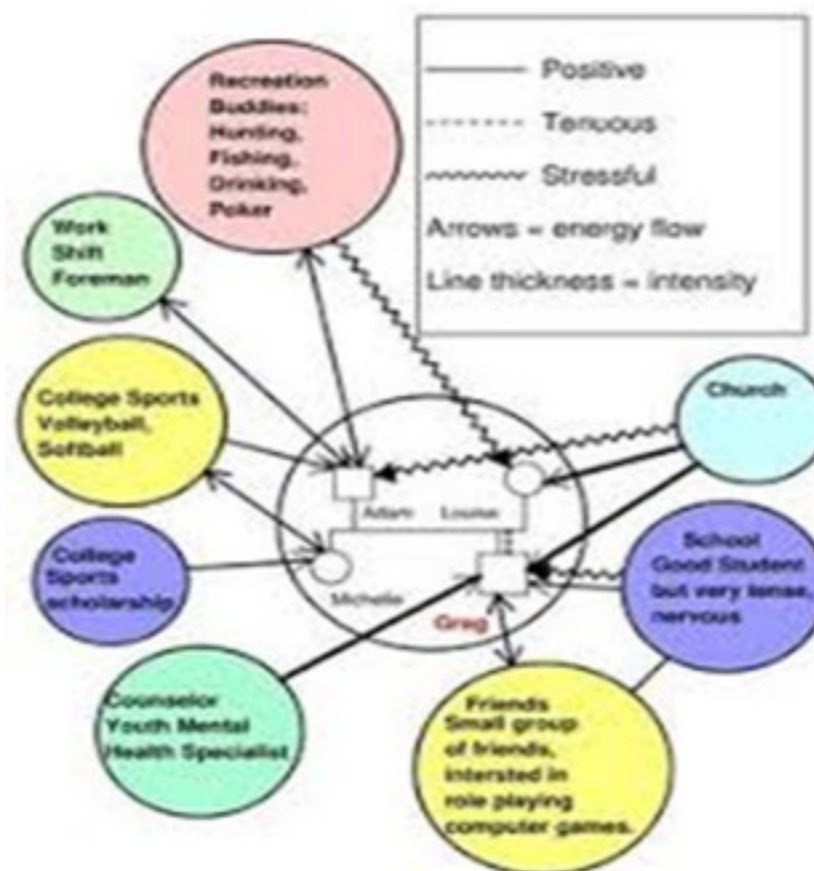
- Vague, but used for a long time
- Hard to measure due to abstract nature
- Comprehensive view of a person/group
- Can be used to recognize power
- Helps to gain perspective of human/client behavior.
- Can be used at any level of practice.

Diagrammatic Assessment of Family Relations Reading

- Systems theory is broad, how can we visualize it?
- Sometimes verbally describing a case is like trying to “listen to football over the radio”.
- Thus social workers created the ecomap and the genogram.

ECO MAP

An ecomap is a diagram that illuminates the systems perspective by showing the social and personal relationships of an individual with his or her environment.





Ecomap Examples →

Ecomap

An Ecomap is a diagram of the relationships of an individual with his or her environment. It is used by social workers or nurses. Ecomap was developed by Inez Hartman who is also credited with creating the Ecogram.



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An Ecomap is sometimes used in a program.
